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Focus On Pertussis

Cases of whooping cough are continuing to rise across England for all age groups, including the under 1-year olds, the group at greatest risk of severe outcomes.

Jan-March 2024 had a total of 2793 cases of pertussis compared to 858 cases in all of 2023. Sadly, there have been 5 reported deaths in infants who developed pertussis in the first quarter of this year. The rise is due to a combination of factors including the cyclical nature of the disease, the impact of the pandemic causing reduced immunity and the uptake of pertussis vaccination falling. Vaccinations are available for pregnant women after 16weeks and should ideally be administered before 32w to ensure that high levels of antibodies against pertussis cross the placenta to protect the baby after birth. It can also be administered to mothers with an infant less than 2 months of age who didn't receive the vaccine in pregnancy. Maternal vaccination provides 97% protection against fatal pertussis in infants under 3 months old.
